- 1) The operator shall ensure that at all times when the premises are open for any licensable activity there is sufficient trained, competent staff on duty at the premises for the purposes of fulfilling the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and for promoting the licensing objectives.
- The operator and designated premises supervisor shall conduct a risk assessment for the general operation of the premises and in the case of individual bespoke events This risk assessment shall be documented and available for inspection by members of the Licensing Authority and/or Northumbria Police upon request and shall take into account the level of staffing, including whether SIA registered door staff should be employed during peak times or bespoke events.
- 3) The maximum number of persons permitted on the premises at any one time shall not exceed a figure prescribed by the risk assessment carried out by the premises licence holder in accordance with fire safety legislation.
- 4) The designated premises supervisor shall ensure that there are effective management arrangements in place to enable him/her to know how many people there are in the premises at times prescribed within the management risk assessment.
- 5) A CCTV system shall be designed, installed and maintained in proper working order, to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority and in consultation with Northumbria Police. Such a system shall:-
 - (i) be operated by properly trained staff;
 - (ii) be in operation at all times that the premises are being used for a licensable activity;
 - (iii) ensure coverage of all entrances and exits to the licensed premises internally and externally;
 - (iv) ensure coverage of such other areas as may be required by the Licensing Authority and Northumbria Police;
 - (v) provide continuous recording facilities for each camera to a good standard of clarity. Such recordings shall be retained on paper or otherwise may be put on tape or otherwise (for a period of 28 days), and shall be supplied to the Licensing Authority or Police Officer on request;
 - (vi) During times licensable activities are provided, a member of management or staff will be contactable and trained in the retrieval of CCTV footage, with the ability to download relevant footage onto a disc

within a reasonable time of any request from Northumbria Police to do so.

- 6) An incident and refusals log shall be maintained on the premises (in writing or digitally) to record incidents and refusals and shall be made available to officers of the Licensing Authority or Northumbria Police upon request. Details of the following shall be recorded:
 - (i) Drugs or other illegal items recovered;
- 7) All crimes reported to the venue or by the venue to the Police;
 - (ii) All ejection of patrons;
 - (iii) Any incidents of disorder;
 - (iv) Any faults in the CCTV system.
- 8) Noise from the licensed premises, including noise from patrons, amplified music and live music shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive property to the premises so as to cause statutory nuisance to nearby residents.
- 9) The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that all relevant members of staff receive training in their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003. Staff training to include the risk of proxy sale. Such training shall be documented, and records made available upon request from the Police or an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority. This will include refresher training which shall be conducted at regular intervals not exceeding 12 months.
- 10) Subject to the exemption within section 150(4) of the Licensing Act 2003, all members of staff at the premises shall seek credible photographic proof of age from any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years and who is seeking to purchase alcohol on the premises. Such credible evidence shall include a photograph of the customer which will either be a passport, photographic driving licence or proof of age card carrying a PASS logo.

Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.

- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:

 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;

- any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
- any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth, will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be shared digitally. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copies of documents as set out above.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
